



The aim of the ACPGBI/Dukes' Club regional trainee representatives is to develop a national network of trainees who will represent regional colorectal trainee views, and to provide local links.

## ROLES

- The regional trainee representative will work alongside the ACPGBI chapter representative to help promote and deliver regional and national ACPGBI and Dukes' Club activities.
- The regional trainee representative will work locally to increase interest in Coloproctology as a career among Medical Students and Junior Surgeons.
- It is anticipated that the Post will be held for a period of 2 years, and commitment for the full term is expected.

## RESPONSIBILITIES

- Regional Trainee reps will uphold the professional standards of The Dukes' Club and ACPGBI, and act as a local 'ambassador' for the organisations.
- It is fully expected that all trainee representatives will promote and attend the ACPGBI Conference each year to support the work of The Dukes' Club and ACPGBI, including helping to deliver Dukes' Club Parallel sessions.
- It is fully expected that all trainee representatives will promote, attend and help to deliver the Dukes' Club Annual Educational Weekend.
- Regional representatives will be expected to deliver a regional networking event within their first 12 months of office to advertise the Dukes' Club and its activities on a regional basis, provide regional networking opportunities for medical students, trainees and consultants and provide educational content relevant to colorectal surgery.
- Failure to fully engage with the above responsibilities will lead to a discussion of your
  position with your local consultant chapter representative. In such cases, Dukes' Club is
  within their remit to remove the role from said individual and re-advertise the position.
